PROGRAMS

Extended Day Program

The Extended Day Program is available to all The John Crosland School students in grades K-12 on regular school days, Monday - Friday, from dismissal until 6 pm. The program will not be offered on holidays, however, it will be offered on some half-days. Extended Day activities include homework time, structured games, art sand crafts, sports, and free play. There is a one-time registration fee, payable at the time of registration.

Tutoring

The John Crosland School offers private tutoring to its students, as well as students in the community in grades 1-12.

Extended Day Enrichment Activities Program

The Extended Day Enrichment Activity Program is available to all The John Crosland School students in grades 1-12. The enrichment activity dates, times, and fees are introduced in three sessions throughout the year. Students must be registered with Extended Day to participate. The one-time registration fee for the E.D.P. is payable at the time of registration.

Sports

The John Crosland School offers an athletic program that encourages and allows for participation for students in grades 5-12 regardless of their playing ability. Sports currently offered are: basketball, golf, cross country, tennis, and flag football.
