A MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL CATHERINE SCHLESINGER

Dear Crosland Parents.

The last two months have flown by and I have settled in nicely. I am feeling very confident about the direction of The John Crosland School and am delighted to be here.

In December, the Board of Directors asked for parent feedback to gauge your satisfaction with the school's performance as well as elicit suggestions about areas in which improvement could be made. I have found the results of this survey to be very valuable in determining areas of focus as I assume responsibilities as Head of School.

The most frequent area mentioned for improvement was communication. I hope you have noticed a more streamlined approach in receiving important information. We are using "In Orbit" every Wednesday as the main vehicle to keep you informed of school activities. Of course, the students continue to use their agendas and school information is available on the usual social media outlets.
